



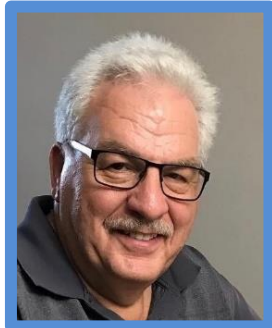

Financial Secretary's Report:

Hi Brothers:

St. Blaise

Born: Sivas Turkey

Died: c.316 Sivas? Turkey

St. Blaise, Latin Blasius, also called Blazey, (born, Sebastia, Cappadocia, Asia Minor [now Sivas, Turkey]—died c. 316, Sebastia?; Western feast day, February 3; Eastern feast day, February 11), early Christian bishop and martyr, one of the most popular medieval saints. He is venerated as the patron saint of sufferers from throat diseases and of wool combers and as one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers.

According to tradition, Blaise was of noble birth and, after being educated in the Christian faith, was made bishop of Sebastia. Although Christianity had been adopted about 300 CE as the state religion in Armenia, the Roman emperor Licinius began a persecution of the Christians, and Blaise was discovered and apprehended. While imprisoned, he miraculously cured a boy from fatally choking. After being torn with wool combers' irons, Blaise was beheaded.

Subsequent legends, notably the apocryphal Acts of St. Blaise, claim that, before Blaise was made bishop, he was a physician possessed of wonderful healing power. Numerous miracles were attributed to him, including the cure of diseased beasts during his refuge, thus accounting for his also being the patron saint of wild animals. He was venerated as the patron of sufferers from throat diseases in the East by the 6th century and in the West by the 9th century. Blaise's cult spread throughout Christendom from the 8th century, and many churches, such as that in Dubrovnik (a city of which he is the patron saint), Croatia, are dedicated to him.

Begun in the 16th century, the blessing of St. Blaise is a ceremony still practiced and celebrated on his feast day in many places. Two candles are consecrated and crossed before the congregation; or a wick, consecrated in oil, is touched to the throats of the faithful. This blessing may be administered by a priest, a deacon, or a lay minister. Blaise's emblems are wax, taper, iron combs (the supposed instruments of his passion), or two crossed candles; in art he is sometimes represented in a cave with animals.

Some of us have a hard time getting to Mass on Feb 3rd for the Saint Blaise throat blessing with the candles.

I like things tidy and I think that the calendar is important. But, a greater good than sticking only to 3 February as the sole day for that blessing is that people receive the blessing.

Remember that the traditional *Rituale Romanum* itself says that it is intended as a starting point for practice and even local rituals. Since I seriously doubt that it is an easy matter to come up with something better than what the Ritual provides, just stick to it.

It is best that you make the effort to get it on St. Blaise Day, since that is the day prescribed. However, well... get it when you can.

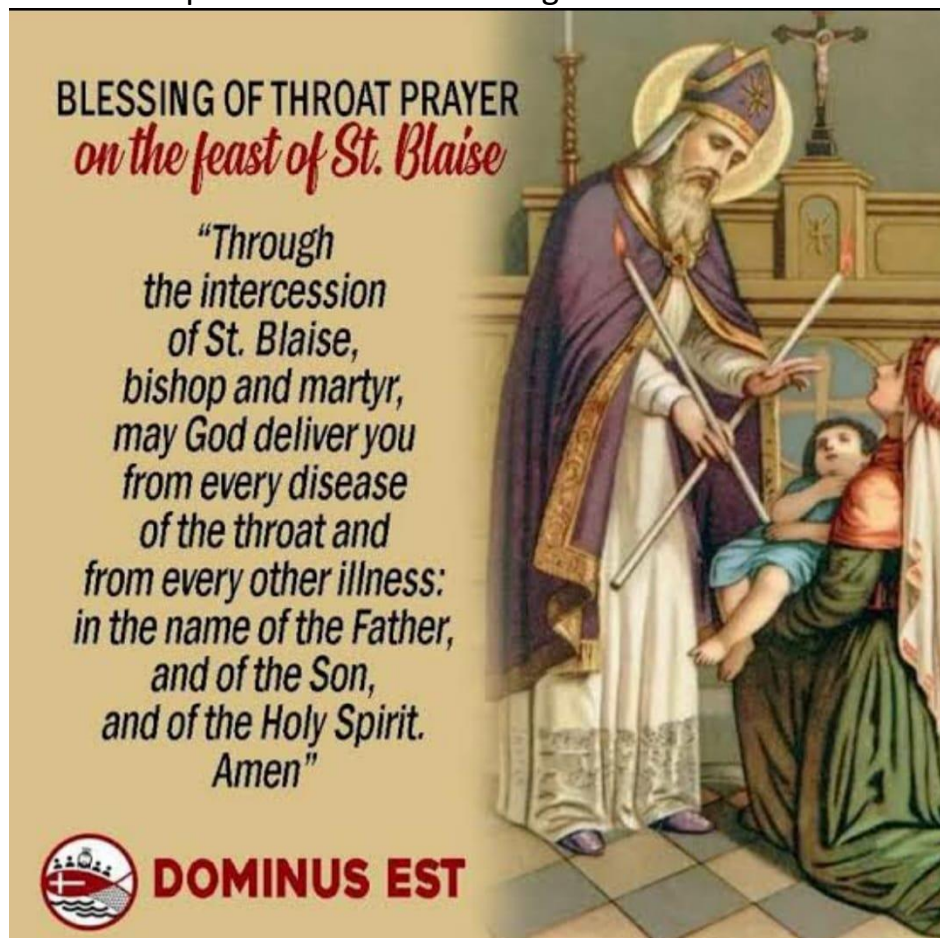
Let's review the blessing for the candles.

God, almighty and all-mild, by your Word alone you created the manifold things in the world, and willed that that same Word by whom all things were made take flesh in order to redeem mankind; you are great and immeasurable, awesome and praiseworthy, a worker of marvels. Hence in professing his faith in you the glorious martyr and bishop, Blaise, did not fear any manner of torment but gladly accepted the palm of martyrdom. In virtue of

which you bestowed on him, among other gifts, the power to heal all ailments of the throat. And now we implore your majesty that, overlooking our guilt and considering only his merits and intercession, it may please you to bless + and sanctify + and impart your grace to these candles. Let all men of faith whose necks are touched with them be healed of every malady of the throat, and being restored in health and good spirits let them return thanks to you in your holy Church, and praise your glorious name which is blessed forever; through Christ our Lord.

How about the blessing of throats?

The Ritual says that the priest holds these candles in the form of a cross under the chin and against the throat of each person who are kneeling before the altar.

Warden's Corner

The 8 Attributes of Highly Effective Council Officer

(or What It Means to Me to be a Council Officer)

Time flies so fast. It's 2023 and in a few months, a new fraternal year will kick in and a new set of Council officers will be elected and installed. I still remember the day when, for the first time, I was installed as an officer of the Sts. Peter and Paul Parish Council 11337 Knights of Columbus for the fraternal year 2022-23. That date was September 11, 2022

(9/11/22) (How can I even forget that date). The investiture ceremony for the elected Council officers was held at the main church of the parish and was presided by our beloved Chaplain, Rev. Fr. Mario Salvadori. With humility and the grace of God, the newly installed officers accepted the responsibility to take on leadership roles in the Council. I am pleased and honored to be serving the Council as its Worthy Warden for that fraternal year. Receiving the Warden's medal was for me a symbol of honor, of commitment to the Order and more importantly, a symbol of service recalling the words of Jesus in the Gospels of St. Matthew (Mt. 20: 28) and St. Mark (10:45): "The Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve..."

When I was elected as one of the Council officers, I consider that as **a call to serve**. To me, a Council officer should possess the attributes listed below to make them "worthy" and effective in their role as leaders of the Council. These attributes all start with the letter "C" in the same manner that most of the names and words we hold dear to our hearts start with the letter "C" such as "Christ", "Catholic", "Christian", "Church", the "Cross", "Columbus", "Council (leaders)", etc. to name a few. Here are those attributes (which of course would not be all-inclusive):

Completely and Clearly Committed to the Cause (CCCC) – As Council officers, we take our leadership role seriously and therefore we just do not just "get involved", we "commit" ourselves to the task—i.e., fully committed to the cause, committed to goals of the Order and its Councils. We are not just "joiners", but we are "doers". We are not just paying the annual membership dues and stuffing our K of C membership card in our wallets and then ignoring the calls from the Grand Knight or other Council officers for assistance and much-needed help in the Council's programs and fund-raising activities or for involvement in Council-sponsored group prayers.

As a Council officer, we take our duties and responsibilities seriously. For example, as a Warden of the Council, I serve as the "watchdog" for Council property (except those property of the financial secretary and treasurer) and is responsible for setting up Council chambers for meetings and ceremonial work. This means making sure Council officers wear their assigned jewels or medals at each meeting and then taking custody of the officers' jewels after the meeting; it means arriving half-an-hour early for the Council meeting to be able to set the meeting room.

Being fully committed to the cause of leadership involves the leader or Council officer willingly serving those they lead and sacrificing and doing it for the sake of the Order and more importantly for the sake of God. An anonymous author once said: "Commitment is the glue that bonds you to your goals."

Courageous – The Knight, especially an officer of the Council, should have a deep, personal love and loyalty to the Catholic Church and to Christ’s Vicar on earth, our Holy Father, the Pope. This means having the **courage** to defend our Mother Church from attacks of the enemies of God and His Church. In order to defend the Church and his faith, a Knight (especially an officer of the Council) should make an effort to learn and study the Catholic Faith, for without such knowledge, he can easily fall prey to the tactics of the enemy and could lead him to compromise on certain matters of faith. In one of his books, St. Josemaria Escriva (a 20th Century saint) writes: *“A man ready to compromise would condemn Jesus to death again...Compromising is a sure sign of not possessing the truth. When a man yields in matters of ideals, of honor, or of faith, that man is without ideals, without honor, and without faith.”*

In addition to defending our faith, we are also obligated to defend the rights of the unborn and should have the **courage** to strongly protest and speak against abortion and against the pro-choice campaign. In one of her words of wisdom, St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta said: *“Abortion destroys the image of God. It is the most terrible plague in our society, the greatest killer of love and peace. Those little children still unborn have been created for bigger things: to love and to be loved.”*

We need to have the **courage** to stand up for what is right, the **courage** to share our gift of faith, the **courage** to be an “apostle” with the zeal of spreading and living the Gospel. **The Knights of Columbus** have a deep devotion to St. Joseph who is our model of **courage**. Accordingly, we pray to him “for the **courage** to stand up and carry out our mission of protecting, defending and raising future generations.” (www.kofc.org/en/what-we-do/faith-in-action-programs/community/index.html)

Compassionate – While on earth, Christ’s whole life was of concern for others. We read in the Gospel of Mark (Chapter 8) when Jesus saw that the large crowd who gathered to hear Him had nothing to eat, He said to His disciples: *“I have **compassion** on the crowd, because they have been with Me three days and have nothing to eat...If I send them away hungry to their own houses, they will faint on the way, for some of them have come from afar.”* We know what happened next, Jesus fed the crowd of about four thousand with a few bread and fish. In the Gospel of Luke (Chapter 7), we saw Jesus and His disciples going to a town named Naim, and as He arrived at the gate of the town, a funeral procession was coming out in which a young man, the only son of his widowed mother, is being carried out. The Evangelist Luke further narrated that Jesus’ heart was filled with **compassion** for her and so Jesus said to her: *“Do not weep”* Then He touched the coffin while the pallbearers stood still. Jesus said to the dead man, *“Young man, I say to thee, arise.!”* And he

who was dead, sat up and began to talk, and Jesus gave him back to his mother. We saw more of these stories of Christ's concern for others: There was story of the man healed at the Pool of Bethesda (John 5:1-15), the story of the man who was blind from birth and then Jesus made him see (John 9:1-41), the story of the ten lepers, and countless other instances. As Council officers, we ought to see things in the **compassionate** eyes of Christ.

St. Teresa of Avila (16th Century) has this to say: *"Christ has no body on earth, but yours; no hands but yours; no feet but yours; your eyes are the eyes through which is to look Christ's **compassion** to the world; yours are the feet with which He is to go about doing good, and yours are the hands with which He is to bless us now."*

Cheerful – In his second letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul said: *"God loves a **cheerful giver**."* (2 Cor. 9: 7). Council officers find JOY in the giving of their time, talent and treasure. Council officers find JOY in serving God, serving their parish community and serving others. St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta wrote: *"Serve God joyfully. Let there be no sadness in your life; the only true sorrow is sin."* **Cheerfulness** and joy are the result of a person's inner peace and well-being. We have all the reasons to be joy-filled and **cheerful** because we know that we are all working for a **"Kingdom with no end"** (In every Sunday Mass, we affirm in the Nicene Creed... *"And His Kingdom will have no end"*).

Cooperative / Collaborative ---A Knight, who also is an officer of the Council, volunteers with a spirit of **collaboration** and **cooperation** and instills such spirit in other member Knights. Many of the work done at the Parish (such as fixing some broken pews, renovating the parish's meeting house, cleaning up the church hall, painting the sheds for storage, setting up tables and chairs for church functions, etc.) and work done for fund-raising activities (such as the Dinner-Dance BBQ event, Fish and Chips Dinner, Food Drive, Diaper Drive, the Delta Bingo Social, etc.) require volunteers from the Council's membership and most of the time, Council officers take the initiative to be the first to "lend a helping hand" and set a good example for others to follow.

In the Philippines, this spirit of **cooperation** and teamwork is also called **"Bayanihan Spirit"**. The term *"bayanihan"* refers to the spirit of communal unity and **cooperation** to achieve a particular goal. The origin of the term can be traced from a common tradition in Philippine towns where community members volunteer to help a family move to a new place by volunteering to transport the house of the family to a specific location. *"The process involves literally carrying the house to its new*

location by putting bamboo poles forming a strong frame to lift the stilts from the ground and carrying the whole house with men positioned at the end of each pole.” (Source: dictionary.sensagent.com/Bayanihan).

Helen Keller (1880-1968), a U.S. writer, social reformer and academic said: **“Alone we can do so little; together we can do so much”**. When I was working as a manager of the internal audit function of a Toronto-based construction company, one of the motivational words I tried to impart to my staff so as to instill in them the spirit of collaboration and teamwork was the acronym **“T-E-A-M”** ---which stands for **“Together Everyone Achieves More.”**

Character – A Knight, especially an officer of the Council, is to be regarded as a man of fine and honourable **character**, exhibiting qualities of honesty and personal integrity, highly ethical and with high moral fiber. He would stand up for his faith and do what is right regardless of how he may be looked at or perceived by others or what it may cost him personally. In times of difficulty, he will develop and exhibit strength of **character** by trusting in God’s providence and conforming his will to God’s will.

Communicator / Consistent Contributor – A Knight, especially an officer of the Council, interacts well and works well with other Council officers and with other Council members, with our chaplain (or parish priest), with the members of the parish community, with other volunteer organizations (e.g. CWL), with other parish volunteers, etc. A Council officer is a generous **“contributor”**, i.e., **contributes** an ample chunk of his *time, talent and treasure* to the Council and its various activities and volunteer works, to the Parish and its ministries, and to the works and needs of the community he belongs to. As a Council officer, he would be diligent in attending and participating in the Council 11337’s Executive meeting which is held every second Tuesday of each and the Council’s General Membership meeting which is held every third Tuesday of each month. He would show **consistency** (another **“C”** attribute) in his participation in these meetings. A Council officer does not hesitate to **communicate** his ideas, concerns, viewpoints, etc. during meeting discussion and conversations and provides inputs or feedback when requested.

Christ-Like – I remember back in the 1990’s during the height of basketball star Michael Jordan’s popularity (after winning back-to-back NBA championships for the Chicago Bulls and MVP honours), a lot of kids, spurred by TV commercials of a brand of sneakers that carried the slogan, *“I wanna be like Mike”*, had dreamt or had aspired of becoming “like Mike”. Such is a very lowly aspiration and purely worldly

ambition from a Christian's point of view and from the perspective of eternity and spirituality. For us Knights especially those of us who are officers of the Council, our slogan should be: **"I wanna be like Christ!"** We ought to **be imitators of Christ**, we ought to **be like Christ** – in our **compassion** and love for others, in our **courage** in defending the truth (and there is only one truth, otherwise, there is no truth at all), in our **courage** to fight hypocrisy (same way how Christ chastised the Pharisees for their hypocrisy), in our **cheerfulness and joy-filled** dispositions, in our **communications** and conversations, in our **collaboration** with others, etc. We should be able to reflect Christ in our lives in the same way as a full moon reflects the light of sun (an analogy that Rev. Fr. Mario had shared with us in his homilies). St. Josemaria Escriva writes: *"May your behaviour and conversations be such that anyone who sees and hears you would say: This man reads the life of Jesus Christ."*

We need to make an honest effort to acquire these traits, these qualities, these attributes, these virtues to be effective in the discharge of our duties and responsibilities as Council leaders. We ask Jesus, our Lord and Model, and His Blessed Mother (who is also our mother) for the grace to serve as Christ served and to be effective in the leadership role entrusted to us.

As Pope Francis writes: *"God calls us so that we become 'what the Lord wished to dream and create'...Your life ought to be a prophetic stimulus to others and leave a mark on this world, the unique mark that only you can leave."* (**Christus Vivit, 162**).

An anonymous author once said: *"True leaders are selfless. They have always been servants of the people first."*

I conclude with this quote from St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta: *"When you look at the inner workings of electrical things, you often see small and big wires, new and old, cheap and expensive, all lined up. Unless the current passes through them, there will be no light. That wire is you and me. The current is God. We have the power to let the current pass through us, use us, produce the light of the world. Or we can refuse to be used and allow darkness to spread."*
