

## Financial Secretary's Report:

Hi Brothers:

January is a busy time as Financial Secretary as the dues notices are sent out and the majority of members pay January and February. Our council annual dues are \$45 per member and go into the General fund.

Why do we have dues?

Well, these basically are used to pay expenses not related to charity events. Examples are stamps for mailing dues notices and membership cards. Refreshments at meetings, officers installation, membership drives. Social functions that are not a charitable fund raiser, e.g. Children's Christmas Party.

Our biggest two expenses from the General Fund are the "Per Capita" paid to both Supreme and State. The per capita amount to be charged are passed by vote on the resolution by councils at the annual conventions. They are used for Supreme for Catholic advertising, State expense, eg. District Deputies travel to meetings.

Per cap dues are based on formula for billable members. Our council currently has 158 members of which 124 are billable. Supreme charges based on these 124 billable plus a charge for inactive members. State uses the supreme roster to bill as well. Supreme charges for the first six months in January then again in July. State charges the whole year. Our January Supreme Per Cap Is \$414.50. Our State per cap due is \$2,526.75. = \$2,941.25 124 billable members x\$45= \$5,580 anticipated receipts from dues Take off the \$2,941.25 leaves \$2,638.75 for operating expenses for the rest of the year. As of today Jan 13<sup>th</sup>, we have 83 billable members who still have to pay their dues.

I have attached a copy of States Per cap letter and invoice which will help explain the per cap process.

## I remind all that dues can be paid by etransfer to <u>fs11337@ontariokofc.ca</u> <u>And on a lighter note</u>:

## Warden's Corner An Antidote to Worrying

Here's a little story that I find quite appropriate to kick off my topic for this month's edition of **The Proclaimer**.

A man met the angel of death. He asked him. "Where are you going?". The angel replied: "I am going to take 100 men." So, the man went to tell the people. That night, 1,000 men died. When the

man saw the angel of death again, he told the angel: "You lied...! You said you will be taking only 100 men, why did 1,000 men die?" The angel of death said: "I didn't lie. I only took 100. **Worry** took the others."'

Who among us have no worries? We **worry** a lot these days—about many things in life. In Canada, we **worry** about getting COVID-19 or our family getting the virus; we worry about money, our finances and how to pay the bills. We worry about inflation, the rising cost of gas and many food items and how they impact our household budget. We are anxious about losing our job or worry about our health and the health of our loved ones. We fear the increasing incidents of burglaries or car theft in our neighbourhood. We worry about becoming a victim of fraud and cyberattacks. We worry about the failing health of our parents or our grandparents or our loved ones. We have anxiety about our children or grandchildren who are living in another town or province or another country. We even worry about climate change and the future of our planet.

People in the Third World countries such as the *Dominican Republic*, have more reasons to **worry** than us in Canada, which is a First World country. The people in the poor countries **worry** about how they are going to put food on their table for each day of the week. They **worry** about finding or keeping a roof above their heads or those of their children. They worry everyday if they will have safe drinking water. They worry about paying rent that if unpaid would get them evicted from their home. They worry about the schooling of their children and how and when to get the money for the tuition fees. They worry about how they can pay the hospital bills to get their ailing parents discharged and so many other worries that we here in Canada take for granted. It makes our worries here in Canada seem more trivial and miniscule and we feel more blessed – more than you can imagine.

Jesus, our Lord, tells us in the Gospel of John: "*Do not let your hearts be troubled?*" "You have faith in God; have faith also in Me." (John 14:1) How often in our lives when in worrying we fail to heed His admonition: "*Have faith in God; have faith in Me*", instead, we give in to our worries and therefore, we deserve to hear His rebuke: "*O you of little faith…!*" (Mt. 8:26 and Mt. 14:31) or His question: "Where is your Faith?" (Lk 8:25). Isn't it true that we have the tendency to try to figure things out for ourselves instead of having 6 | Page

faith in God? How is it that we often feel that we can do a better job solving our own problems by ourselves or addressing our concerns our way instead of giving those worries and concerns to the Lord in an attitude of faith?

St. Peter in his letter (**1Pt 5:7**) said: "*Cast all your worries upon Him because He cares for you*." St. Peter is stating to us an absolute fact, a real hard fact, a truth of our Catholic faith: Our God is a caring God. He cares for us more than we can imagine because He loves us so intensely – He loves us more – a thousand times more –than we love ourselves. God has only our best interest in His mind. He will always be there for us. Jesus is telling us every time we have worries and concerns (like that one line in a famous song): "Just call my Name and I'll be there..." And since He is God, He is also infinitely powerful which means that nothing is impossible to Him.

I was at Puerto Plata in the Dominican Republic for a week in July 2022 (along with Brother Fred and Brother Dilly and about 100 other Saints Peter and Paul Parishioners) on a mission trip and have seen firsthand the lack of basic necessities of life that the poor and impoverished people of DR worry about on a daily basis. And yet, with God's grace, these people have taken all their problems, hardships, deprivations, poverty, and other difficulties of life in stride and seemed to have placed their faith in the words of Jesus Christ in the Gospel of Matthew (**Mt. 6:25-27**). *"Therefore, I say to you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on...Can any of you through worrying add a single moment to your span of life?"* 

St. Francis de Sales admonishes: "Do not fear what may happen tomorrow. The same loving Father who cares for you today will care for you tomorrow and every day. Either He will shield you from suffering or He will give you unfailing strength to bear it. Be at peace then and put aside all **anxious** thoughts and imaginings."

In addition to St. Francis de Sales, many of the saints in heaven have given us words of wisdom that we should take to heart.

St. Padre Pio of Pietrelcina said: "Pray, hope and **don't worry**. **Worry** is useless. God is merciful and will hear your prayer."

St. John Vianney has a similar advise when he said: "God commands you to pray, but He forbids you to worry."

St. Francis de Sales again said: "Do well what you can, and the rest leave to God, who will do it sooner or later, according to the disposition of His divine providence."

In the same note, St. Augustine of Hippo said: "Trust the past to the mercy of God, and the present to His love, and the future to His providence."

As disciples of Jesus Christ, we need to switch our focus from worrying to counting our blessings—the many blessings we have received from our loving Father in heaven. When our minds tend to worry, let us recall the words of Jesus: *"Trust in God. Trust also in Me."* **(John 14:1)**. We need to trust in God more and worry less. Let us ask God our Father for the grace to keep our mind and heart focused on Jesus for we know that He is the only One who can offer us the tranquility of heart and mind we need to cast our worries away. Jesus always has our best interest in mind. He wants us to be happy.

# Special Guest Contributor. Brother Mark Jennings ALL KNIGHTS SHOULD UNDERSTAND COUNCIL OFFICER ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.

Each year your council elects and appoints new men to take on leadership roles within your council. Sometimes these roles are well-defined, while the position may be expanded based on that individual's talents or interests. The following text offers an approach that may be helpful for new councils in appointing the first set of officers or for existing councils looking to expand the responsibilities of their existing officers.

#### **Elected Positions**

<u>Grand Knight</u> - The Grand Knight is the council's, Chief Executive Officer. He is responsible for setting council goals and ensuring that all officers fulfill their duties in reaching these objectives. He presides over all meetings; appoints program and committee directors as needed; fills officer roles in the event of vacancies; countersigns checks and orders for payment; and oversees the council's degree team. Ideally, the grand knight should be a junior so that, as a senior, he can serve as a mentor for the next Grand knight. In addition, the Grand Knight must complete the Safe Environment training.

**Deputy Grand Knight** - The deputy grand knight serves as the Grand Knight's right-hand man and fills in for the Grand Knight when absent. Some Deputy Grand Knights serve as their council's program director. Ultimately, he assists the Grand Knight in leading the council and reaching council objectives. In some councils, the deputy grand knight role might be used to groom a possible Grand Knight candidate for the following year. Finally, the Deputy Grand Knight may serve as a liaison between the council and other groups that share similar interests (i.e. Newman Club, pro-life club, etc.).

<u>Chancellor</u> - The Chancellor assists the Grand and Deputy Grand Knights in leading the council by engaging and strengthening the council's membership. His primary responsibilities include recruiting and retaining members, and to this end, he should set up events that display the values and principles of the

Knights of Columbus. In addition, the Chancellor should participate in the council's degree team and serve on both the Admission and Retention committees.

 $\underline{\text{Treasurer}}$  – The Treasurer is responsible for managing the council funds in the bank. He receives money from the financial secretary and deposits funds into council accounts. He is also responsible for paying all council expenses. He also balances and verifies the ledger and keeps the updated budget approved by the council.

Advocate - The Advocate acts as the Council Parliamentarian. He should be knowledgeable in *Robert's Rules of Order and Methods of Conducting a Council Meeting* (#11337). He may seek legal assistance from the state Advocate should issues arise. The Advocate should be able to take on additional responsibilities as the council deems necessary.

**<u>Recorder</u>**: The Recorder is responsible for recording all meetings and events held by the council. He should record minutes, conversations and other information helpful to the council and prepare them to be distributed to the membership promptly. Additionally, he should help with council event notifications and meeting reminders and assist with council social media responsibilities.

<u>Warden -</u> The Warden is responsible for the property owned by the council. He is also responsible for setting up meetings and leads inside and outside guards.

<u>Inside/Outside Guards</u> - The Inside and Outside Guards carry out tasks given to them by the Grand Knight and follow the Warden's orders. In addition, they are responsible for checking Membership Cards and allowing entrance to meetings. Councils should consider appointing additional inside and outside guards, especially among promising freshmen, as this provides early leadership opportunities.

<u>**Trustees (3)**</u> - The Trustees advise the Grand Knight, supervise the council's financial matters, and conduct the semi-annual audits. Usually, the immediate past Grand Knight will serve as a trustee.

#### **Appointed Positions**

**<u>Chaplain</u>** - The Chaplain is the Spiritual Leader of the council. He nurtures the faith in council members, mainly through the Sacraments but also through Spiritual direction, retreats and other events and support. The Grand Knight should meet regularly with the council Chaplain to see how the council can best support the Catholic community.

**Financial Secretary** - The financial secretary is chosen by the trustees and the officers of the council for a three-year term and approved by the Supreme Knight. He provides continuity in the council and is responsible for collecting dues and ensuring that the council's financial recordings are kept up to date. Additionally, he ensures that membership records are current, issues membership cards, and files regular reports to the district, regional, province and supreme.

**Lecturer** - The Lecturer provides brief spiritual discourses and reflections during business meetings for the "Good of the Order ."If the Lecturer cannot be present, he should appoint a council member to give the reflection.

**<u>Program Director</u>** - The Program Director is appointed by the Grand Knight and oversees the Faith in Action areas of Faith, Family, Community and Life. In some councils, this may be the duty of the Deputy Grand Knight. The Program Director ensures that all his subordinate committees meet regularly and plan appropriate events. In addition, he communicates individual committee reports to the Grand Knight. Keeps

accurate records of council programs for reporting on the *Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity* (#11337) and the *Columbian Award Application* (#SP-7). Must complete required Safe Environment training.

**Faith Director** - The Faith Director is appointed by the Grand Knight and reports to the Program Director. Responsible for all faith-based council programs.

**Family Director** - The Grand Knight appoints the Family Director and reports to the Program Director. Responsible for all family-based council programs. The Supreme Council offers <u>5 college-specific family</u> <u>programs</u>. Must complete required Safe Environment training and background check.

<u>**Community Director</u>** - The Grand Knight appoints the Community Director and reports to the Program Director. Responsible for all community-based council programs. He directs programs that support and encourage service to the community that fight poverty, aids the individual, promotes athletic events, and sponsors more extensive programs and campaigns. He should be comfortable contacting and coordinating with organizations that align in key areas of community assistance. Must complete required Safe Environment training and background check.</u>

<u>Life Director</u> - The Grand knight appoints the Life Director and reports to the Program Director. Responsible for all life-based council programs. The individual assigned to this position should be comfortable discussing and planning efforts within the context of supporting and affirming life in all stages and conditions. Notably, he strives to promote programs that support and encourage the advancement of the pro-life movement, people with intellectual disabilities and persecuted Christians.

<u>Membership Director</u> - The Membership Director serves as the head of the Admission Committee and works to grow the council's membership through new and transfer members. He should actively identify potential recruits, plan recruitment programs, host informational meetings and encourage council members to seek candidates. In addition, the Membership Director should ensure that a council has access to frequent degree exemplifications and should work that each member reaches their degree promptly.

**<u>Retention Chairman</u>** - The Retention Chairman works to keep the council's members active. Implements programs and practices that provide mentors for new members and regularly communicates with the members to encourage their participation. When a council wishes to suspend members, the Retention Chairman must reach out to members and ask them to keep their membership or transfer to another council.




